TOOLS

GOOD NEWS FOR HOME HANDYMEN AND WOMEN!! Wash. Energy Extension Service, with the help of Metrocenter, has recently opened 2 Tool Banks to facilitate weatherization projects for Seattle residents and business owners. Hand tool and ladders (up to 30 ft) are available serving the Queen Anne and Capitol Hill areas but you DO NOT have to be a resident of those particular neighborhoods to utilize the tool banks. The banks are located at: Stevens Rehab Office-522-19 Ave E...& St Pauls Episcopal Church-15Roy St.

According to Rene Tillman, project director, there are enough tools and equipment to open 2 more banks on Capitol Hill and 2 more in the Queen Anne areas...if space can be found for them. Part of a garage or old tool shed would do; they do not require much space. Persons to handle check-out requests are also needed. Anyone interested please call Rene at 447-3625. If these tool banks are utilized this year, the tool bank project will be extended to cover the entire county next year.

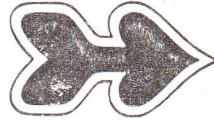
On Friday, Sept. 16, a public hearing was held for Rapunzel's Tavern's request for a Conditional Use Permit and a Variance to remove a duplex at 3257 Fuhrman Ave E, and install a parking lot for tavern patrons. The Eastlake Council Board submitted comments on the proposal; both good and bad points were stressed in how the planned actions related to the Eastlake Goals and Policies.

Items of primary concern included the fact that a single-family style house and low income housing would be removed and replaced by a parking lot in a residential zone. It was felt, however, that this loss of housing, in exchange for the continued existance of the business in its present form would be offset by the following: 1) Relief of some parking problems currently being experienced in the particular neighborhood and 2) the owner's statements (in meetings with the Eastlake Board) promising future exterior renovation with no increase in tavern capacity. The qualified support of the Board was not by unanimous vote.

The decision by the Hearing Examiner will be announced on September 19, 1978, and will be appealable to either the City Council or the Board of Adjustments.
