

A CRUCIAL ISSUE WHICH COULD DRASTICALLY CHANGE THE EASTLAKE AREA is now in the works. It's the proposed Neighborhood Commercial Zoning Policies by the City of Seattle's Land Use and Transportation Project, and it could have serious implications for several sections in our area. Did you know that your place of residence or business could now be scheduled for a rezoning change -- either rrom a residential zone to a commercial zone, OR, a commercial zone to a residential zone? The consequences for Eastlakers are too numerous for us to even begin to discuss here and we only need say that it could have a very major effect on your living and/or working environment in the very near future. Want to know more? Attend the January 18 Eastlake Community Council meeting! We'll have representatives on hand from the Land Use and Transportation Project office to discuss the proposed commercial zoning policies, and the Department of Construction and Land Use to review the present and new multi-family zoning regulations now in place. This is one meeting you absolutely cannot afford to miss. Be there!
