



2510 Fairview E.: Deck and stair for Ron Kasprisin Architect's office.

2012 Eastlake E.: 20 condominium units not being built yet.

2216 Minor E.: 12 condominium units not being built yet.

2329 Yale E.: 9 condominium units under construction.

55-65 E. Roanoke: "Roanoke Reef" condominiums under construction.

80 E. Roanoke: public viewing platform.

120 E. Edgar: Artist's studio addition not being built yet

123 E. Edgar: 5-unit apartment not being built yet.

1700 Franklin E.: Rezone for mini--warehouses under the freeway still not granted.
