<u>Heliocopters</u>--The decision of the Shorelines hearings Board prohibiting Sea First from building a helipad on the computer center has been overturned in Superior Court by Judge Mifflin. Corporation Counsel did not bother to notify Eastlake Council until just seven days before an appeal filing was due. In the meantime, Corporation Counsel quietly decided not to pursue an appeal, and now Eastlakers can add heliocopters to the float plane noise. The noise ordinance is not due for a vote on plane noise until July 1977. There is no safety ordinance for Lake Union. One day, a heliocopter and a float plane are going to collide over a tour boat. Then maybe the danger of the present situation will become apparent to all. In the meantime, chalk up another blooper to Corporation Counsel.

<u>Diverter</u>—The Transportation Committee of the City Council has put off the matter of the temporary traffic diverter once again, due to business complaints that they did not receive adequate notice of the previous public hearing. Another public hearing will be held in January in the Eastlake neighborhood. The exact date is not yet determined.
